

Mission of the USPFO

As agents of the Chief, National Guard Bureau:

- Receive & account for all federal funds, property and real property (Army & Air) in the possession of the State National Guard.
- Supervise all acquisitions, contract and supply activities.
- Ensure federal funds are expended, and property is used in conformance with applicable federal statues and regulations.


Overview of the USPFO program

USPFOs are the sole Federal Agents of the Chief National Guard Bureau in the states:

- Roles and responsibilities of the USPFO interface across the entire NGB enterprise.
- 32 USC 708 allows for the USPFO to entrust resources to an officer of the state, but by law the USPFO remains pecuniary responsible.

USPFO Acquisition Support Functions & Responsibilities

- All Federal Contracting at State level
- Contracting Warrants flow from Federal authority
- Cradle to grave acquisition
- Small Business Specialist
- Government Purchase Card
- Goods, services, and construction
- Contracting Officer Representative







Typical Procurements

- Construction in support of the Portland & Kingsley Field Air National Guard Base(s)
 - Repair & Sustainment projects Roofs, fences, water lines, hangars, storm drains, paving
 - New Construction Fire Station, Security Facilities and exterior lighting.
- Architect Engineer Services in support of the Portland & Kingsley Field Air National Guard Base(s)
 - Repair & Modification Upgrade electrical, hangars, roofs, inspection services
 - New Construction Fire Station, Security Facilities and exterior lighting.
- Services (Air & Army Guard)
 - Catered Meals
 - Medical Assessments
 - Child Care
 - Training
- Supplies / Commodities (Air & Army Guard)
 - Exercise Equipment
 - Furniture
 - Equipment Rental



Three Steps

- Step 1: Register with the Federal Government
- Step 2: Finding an Opportunity
- Step 3: Small Business Assistance



Step 1:

Register to do business with the Federal Government

- Data Universal Numbering System & Bradstreet: Issues a unique numeric identifier to a single business entity. http://fedgov.dnb.com/webform
- Prospective contractors shall be registered in the System for Award Management (SAM) prior to contract award. https://www.sam.gov/portal/SAM/#1
 - During the DUNS and SAM Registration processes you will be asked for the following:
 - North American Industry Classification System (pronounced "nakes") code (NAICS). NAICS is the standard used by Federal statistical agencies in classifying business establishments for the purpose of collecting, analyzing, and publishing statistical data related to the U.S. business economy.

 - Commercial and Government Entity Code (CAGE). CAGE Code is a unique identifier assigned to suppliers to various government or defense agencies, as well as to government agencies themselves and also various organizations. CAGE codes provide a standardized method of identifying a given facility at a specific location. http://www.dlis.dla.mil/cage_welcome.asp
 - Employer Identification Number (EIN) Employer Identification Numbers are issued for the purpose of tax administration. http://www.irs.gov/Businesses/Small-Businesses-&-Self-Employed/How-to-Apply-for-an-EIN
- Wide Area Workflow (WAWF): USPFO entitlement system for vendor pay. It is a secure web based system for electronic invoicing, receipt, and acceptance of goods or services. https://wawf.eb.mil/



Step 2: Finding an Opportunity

Micro Purchase:

 Micro-purchases; generally under \$3,500 supplies or \$2,500 for services under the Service Contract Labor Standards.

Simplified Acquisition:

- Opportunities are posted via GSA e-Buy. We use this method to obtain price competition at any dollar amount if necessary. A Sources sought may also be issued via GSA e-Buy.

- Federal Business Opportunities website site (FBO) Opportunities are posted via FBO. We use this
 method to obtain price competition at any dollar amount if necessary. https://www.fbo.gov/.
- Fedbid: Reverse Bid Auctions when appropriate, such as hotel rooms and conferences.

Step 3: Small Business Assistance

- Small Business Administration: Congress created the Small Business Administration, whose function is to "aid, counsel, assist and protect, insofar as is possible, the interests of small business concerns." https://www.sba.gov/offices/district/or/portland
- Procurement Center Representatives (PRCs): SBA employs Procurement Center Representatives (PCRs) to assist small businesses in obtaining federal contracts. https://www.sba.gov/content/procurement-center-representatives.
